Now, two days after Rex was disbarred in Maryland over his federal conviction, I continue singing his praises just as strongly, and told the Maryland Daily Record as much, on July 30, 2007. The world and the legal community need more selfless and caring people with sharp minds. That continues to be Rex. I am sure that Rex will continue on that path.
